SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT COMMODITY BASED PROCUREMENT POLICY

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### 1. BACKGROUND

Eastern Cape Provincial Government promotes targeted procurement in respect of designated commodities. Mbhashe Local Municipality is in favour of promoting commodity based procurement of goods and services from local manufacturer's and/or suppliers. The provincia designated commodities index list, as amended by GPG from time to time as well as additiona commodities specific to Mbhashe is used as the basis of procurement where practically implementable.

# 2. SECTORS IDENTIFIED FOR LOCAL PROCUREMENT

National Treasury, in collaboration with the Department of Trade and Industry, has identifie various sectors and issued Circular 69 that prescribes the invitation and evaluation of bids base on the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content of these goods an services.

National Treasury issues circulars with effect to the various sectors as they are identified an finalised.

#### 3. OBJECTIVE

It is the objective of the Municipality to promote local procurement to enhance job creation an sustainability.

In order to give effect to this initiative, Mbhashe LM will endeavour to procure goods and o services from locally situated vendors, either within Mbhashe LM's direct geographic area o within the District area.

## 4. MBHASHE LOCAL MUNICIPALITY SECTORS

Over and above the sectors identified by National Treasury, Mbhashe Local Municipality ha identified the following commodities to be locally procured (where possible) subject to the provisions of the applicable legislation, as set out in the table below:
